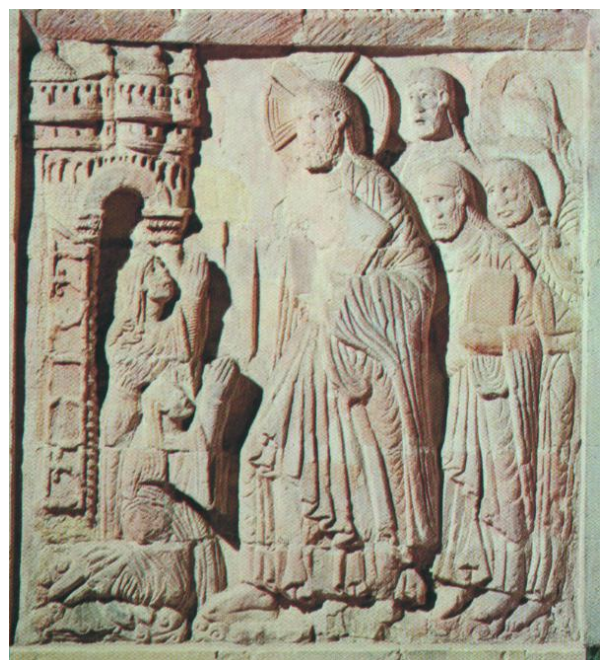
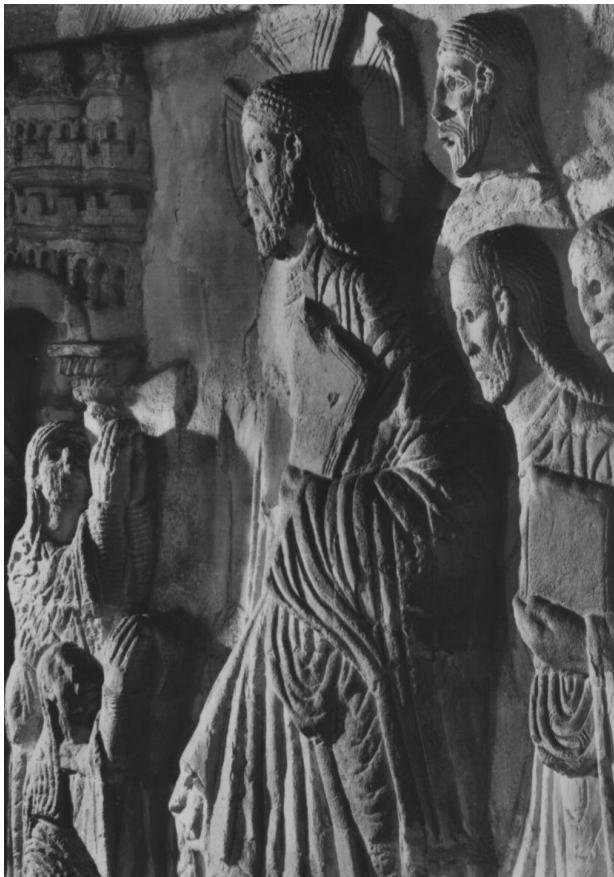
### Relief carvings

On site of Anglo-Saxon church dedicated to St. Peter. Two sculptured reliefs presently situated in the South aisle of the choir. One relief shows the raising of Lazarus. The other the arrival of Christ at Bethany. The deeply carved eye-sockets in the face of Christ are thought by some to have held jewels or crystal. It has been suggested that they were brought from the Cathedral at Selsey, when the See was moved.

They have been dated both before and after the Norman Conquest. Talbot-Rice claims that they are before, c. 1000.

### Chest

An Anglo-Saxon chest is allegedly to be found here. Mentioned by Harrison in *Notes on Sussex Churches*
