## Description of church

Now single-cell church but E end has filled round-head arch containing later windows, possibly leading to original chancel. Arch head of irregular, segmented stones with square imposts flush with wall, jambs upright-and-flat with column let into W face, with elongated, fluted, cushion capital below impost. About C12.

S wall has two round-head, single-splay windows with rectangular stone lights cut from single slab, jambs face-alternate, no imposts, arch-head of segmented stones.

N wall E end has window similar to S window described above, and possibly another, blocked, at W end corresponding to S side. The windows possibly Anglo-Saxon.

N wall exterior has pilaster-strip of irregular long-and-short work.

NW, SW and SE quoins visible, upright-and-flat
