### Date

Aisled nave; and apsidal chancel with crypt beneath. Period A with alterations to the chancel and the crypt in period C.

### Notes

Church built on basilican plan. Heptagonal apse with crypt beneath. Staircase went down to crypt from each side of chancel arch.

### Crypt

Possibly built using walls already standing and this structure was probably of the same period as nave (AD C7) alterations being made in C10 or C11 AD at E end. Mr Blatch's pamphlet (title?) gives a careful account following careful examination in 1960 by Drs Fletcher and Jackson who published a paper on it in the British Archæological Association's journal 1962. In C10 or C11 AD the crypt was replanned with a *confessio* in middle and walkway round it leading to stairs to chancel (*c.f.* REPTON, where crypt built within standing walls).

### Nave

Contains some Roman tiles concealed by plaster. N aisle partly original work. In E wall is Saxon doorway. Chancel arch has span of 21', very wide for Anglo-Saxon arch. Window above it of later date, but still Anglo-Saxon. Two doorways at W end of nave 20' above ground: use not known. If there was a Saxon W tower, it has gone, and was replaced in C15 AD. Nave arches are C7 or earlier.
